Julia Krahn: SchönerHeit - Song of Songs in Pictures

Photography exhibition and presentation of the catalog at St. Johannis Church, Göttingen, Germany 19 May – 22 June 2016

Hanover / Göttingen. The internationally renowned artist Julia Krahn began working on the portrait series *SchönerHeit* in 2013 as a commission from the Anna von Borries Foundation, and now it will be shown for the first time in a photography exhibition. The series focuses on twelve residents of an institution run by DIAKOVERE Annastift Leben und Lernen—people with almost exclusively physical disabilities.

The project *SchönerHeit* portrays the beauty of people with disabilities in a new light through an artistic lens and questions conventional ideals of beauty. In her work, Julia Krahn often deals with social values, societal change, and the subject of religion. For the first time, neither she herself nor people from her immediate family are featured in her work. In close cooperation with the residents, she created moving scenes that express their unique and loveable qualities in every picture.

The Song of Songs from the Bible, with its rich imagery and associations on the theme of love and beauty, serves as an inspiration and connecting thread for the series. Bishop Ralf Meister: "The artist portrayed the participants as in the love song of the Old Testament: *How beautiful you are, my darling! Oh, how beautiful! Your eyes are doves. How handsome you are, my beloved! Oh, how charming! And our bed is verdant. (Song of Songs 1:15–16)"*

"The people portrayed in the photographs were able to present themselves playfully and freely. The photographs show us the individuals without putting them on display. For the participants it was important to be seen with their disability, but not because of it," states Dr. Ulrich Spielmann, Managing Director of Diakovere Annastift Leben und Lernen gGmbH and Chairman of the Anna von Borries Stiftung. The foundation, whose mission is to support people with disabilities, initiated and funded the entire project with support from the Hanns-Lilje-Stiftung.

The exhibition with a selection of photographs will be opened by Bishop Ralf Meister on 19 May 2016 at 6 p.m. at St. Johannis Church in Göttingen; the artist and the participants will be present. The works will be on view until 22 June 2016 from Wednesday to Friday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Later the series will travel to Bremerhaven, Hildesheim, Verden, and Hanover, and will also be part of the group exhibition *Kunst trotzt Handicap* in the Marktkirche in Hanover (21 September – 19 October 2016), as well as Kassel, Bremen, and the Landesgartenschau 2017 in Apolda.

A **catalog** will be published with numerous color illustrations, a foreword by Bishop Ralf Meister, and essays by Beatrice Buscaroli, Angela Madesani, and Gian Paolo Serino, as well as an extensive look behind the scenes. The publication will include texts in German, English, Italian, and Plain Language (German).

Julia Krahn was born in in Jülich and grew up in Aachen. In 2001 she left her studies in medicine in Freiburg and moved to Milan to fully dedicate herself to art. Today she works with



various galleries in multiple countries. Her works are shown in museums and galleries around the world. She has received several prizes. Most recently she was featured at the Landesmuseum Hannover and the Lentos Kunstmuseum Linz.

The **Anna von Borries Stiftung** is a dependent foundation that supports assistance for people with disabilities, the elderly, public health care, and education. It mainly supports the charitable organizations DIAKOVERE Annastift Leben und Lernen gGmbH and DIAKOVERE Krankenhaus Annastift gGmbH, but also engages in its own activities. It is a foundation in trusteeship of Annastift e.V.

Julia Krahn - CV

Julia Krahn was born in Jülich and grew up in Aachen (Germany). To devote herself completely to photography, in 2000 she leaves medical school at the Albert Ludwig Universität Freiburg (Germany) and moves to Milan (Italy), where in 2001 she starts her collaboration with the Galleria Magrorocca. In 2003 she inaugurates her first solo shows Schatten and Von Gaensen und Elefanten. Different group shows follow between Italy, London (Great Britain), Tokyo (Japan). In 2007 she opens her solo show The Creation of Memory at Galleria Magrorocca in Milan. In 2008 she is selected for participation in the Biennial of Tehran (Istanbul) and wins the second Prize San Fedele, Milan. In 2009 she wins the Special mention in the Tequila Cuervo Centenario Award for Emerging artist - Zona Maco Art Fair, Mexico City (Mexico). In 2010 she exhibits at the Fondazione Bevilacqua La Masa in Venice, participates in the group show Mutter at the Kulturzentrum bei den Minoriten in Graz (Austria) and inaugurates her soloshow Ja, Ich Will! at Zirkumflex in Berlin (Germany). With her solo show Angelus Militans in Milan in 2011 she starts her collaboration with Carlotta Testori Studio. In 2012 she opens her solo show Lilies and Linen at Accart in Bozen (Italy) and Mother Loves You at Voice Gallery in Marrakech (Marocco). The same year she gets selected finalist at the Premio Combat 2012. In 2013 she opens her solo shows Leidenschaften at the Stiftung St. Matthäus in Berlin and Beyond Belief at the Museum Musei Civici Imola (Italy) and participates at several group shows. In 2014 she opens her solo show Trust me at HdkK in Stuttgart (Germany) and she wins the 1st prize 1003 - 100 artisti -100 stanze at the Art Hotel Gran Paradiso in Sorrento (Italy), where her work Sirens is permanently exposed. In 2015 she opens It might have been a pigeon, solo show at the Museum Diocesano di Milano and she exhibits at the Museo Castelvecchio in Verona (Italy) and Fondazione Stelline di Milano, and on that she publishes Last Supper - Julia Krahn. The same year her work is present at the Landesmuseum Hannover (Germany) at the show Madonna Woman-Mother-Idol, at the Lentos Kunstmuseum at Linz (Austria) for Rabenmütter and she returns to Kultum in Graz (Austria) to show at Reliqte Reloaded. In 2016 she shows for the first time SchönerHeit.
